'Hurray!' Jilly yelled again.


'What about some green smoke?' he called.

'What's he doing?' Ian asked Alan. They hadn't noticed the Tyrannosaurus yet.


Then they saw the fence come down. The Tyrannosaurus was free! It stood on the park road, eyeing the two cars.
